Brief History of the APR Scout Foundation

The APR Scout Foundation was established in 1991 and raised funds in the course of more than 30 years. The Foundation envisions the growth of quality Scouting in member countries and strengthening self-reliance. To achieve this, grants and non-interest-bearing loans are provided to member countries for various projects.

For good governance, the then Regional Scout Committee made sure that the management and controls are in place, thus establishing the APR Scout Foundation Management Committee to ensure proper management, while Scout Association of Hong Kong was requested to serve as Trustee to ensure the safekeeping of the funds. The APR Support Center is the Secretariat to liaise and coordinate on the Foundation matters. From the seed amount of US\$10,000, the Foundation fund has reached to \$3.3M as of August 2025.



Support for the APR Triennial Plan

From 2022 to 2025, the Asia-Pacific Regional Scout Foundation supported various initiatives focused on strengthening Scouting. In 2023, key events included workshops on crisis communication, humanitarian action, peacebuilding, wellness awareness, and youth engagement in sustainable development goals. Staff development was supported through a workshop on data analysis and environmental sustainability. In 2024, workshops focused on inclusivity, educational policies, and cultural diversity, with events like the Adults in Scouting Workshop in Japan and the Diversity and Inclusion Forum in Taiwan. In 2025, workshops continued to address key priorities such as diversity, health, and social impact, with notable events in the Philippines, Nepal, and Malaysia, all contributing to the Region's goals for inclusive and impactful Scouting.



2022

National Youth Involvement Workshop, May 2022, Vietnam

Pathfinder Scouts Vietnam organized the National Youth Involvement Workshop from 5–8 May 2022, in Ho Chi Minh City, gathering 39 participants from Vietnam and one from the Boy Scouts of the Philippines. The workshop focused on understanding young people's aspirations, promoting inclusion, and strengthening intergenerational dialogue in line with the World Scout Youth Involvement Policy.



APR Youth Leadership Training Course, July 2022, Thailand

From 19–23 July 2022, the Asia-Pacific Regional Youth Leadership Training gathered 35 Scouts from 20 NSOs in Chon Buri, Thailand. Supported by the Eric Frank Trust, Messenger of Peace, and the APR Scout Foundation, the training built leadership skills through sessions on teamwork, conflict management, and ethical decision-making. The event also featured cultural activities and community project presentations, marking an important step in reconnecting Scouts post-pandemic.



2023



The APR Forum on Scouts for Sustainable Development Goals, April 2023, Hong Kong

The long-awaited Asia-Pacific Region (APR) Forum on Scouts for Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) hosted by the Scout Association of Hong Kong (SAHK) was finally held on 7-10 April 2023 after five postponements due to the Covid-19 pan-

dem. The Forum brought together 36 participants representing 11 different National Scout Organizations (NSOs)¹ and 5 other local uniformed groups², with a total of 84 Forum staff contributing to its eventual success.

Awareness Workshop on Scouts for SDGs, July 2023, Nepal

Nepal Scouts, a non-formal education youth movement in collaboration with the Asia-Pacific Region of the World Organization of the Scout Movement, has successfully organised the Awareness Workshop on Scouts for SDGs:

An Educational Opportunity gathering 30 participants from eight NSOs and Duke of Edinburgh's International Award) from 4-7 July 2023 at Park Village, Budhanilkantha, Kathmandu, Nepal.



APR Workshop on Crisis Communication, February 2025, Maldives

The APR Workshop on Crisis Communication and Reputation Management was held 22-2025 February 2025 in the Maldives, bringing together participants from nine countries, along with facilitators from the World Organization of the Scout Movement (WOSM) and Scouting in the Asia-Pacific Region.



APR Wellness Awareness Workshop, April 2023

The APR Awareness Workshop on Wellness and Safety in Scouting was held virtually from 24 to 26 April 2023 attended by 62 participants representing 17 NSOs. Scouts and leaders actively engaged in conversations about the challenges faced by youth and the importance of fostering an environment where they feel supported, heard, and safe. Throughout the sessions, the workshop underscored the Region's continued commitment to prioritizing wellness and protection in all aspects of Scouting.



Asia-Pacific Youth Mobilisation Summit, June 2023, Malaysia

From 15–18 June 2023, Malaysia hosted the Asia-Pacific Youth Mobilisation Summit, organised by the Big 6 Youth Organisations in the Region. The Summit gathered young leaders to strengthen collaboration and develop a joint project advancing the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). Participants also built their skills in addressing local and global challenges while exploring strategies for meaningful youth cooperation. The summit served as a platform to amplify youth voices, encourage shared learning, and drive sustainable impact across the Asia-Pacific.



First APR Humanitarian Action Workshop, October 2023, Thailand

From 19–22 October 2023, the Asia-Pacific Region held its first Humanitarian Action Workshop at Vajiravudh Scout Camp, Thailand, with 38 participants from 12 NSOs. Organized under the Region's Social Impact initiatives, the event focused on strengthening Scouts' role in disaster response, aligning with global humanitarian standards, and sharing best practices. Participants also visited Pattaya Remand Prison to learn about the Ticket to Life Project. The workshop concluded with a call to form a Regional Humanitarian Network to boost preparedness and collaboration.

Thailand Hosts 51st APR Basic Management Course, November 2023

The 51st Asia-Pacific Regional Basic Management Course for Scout Executives was held from 20–30 November 2023 at Vajiravudh Scout Camp, Thailand. Forty-six participants from 14 NSOs joined the 11-day program, which covered leadership, governance, project management, and organisational psychology. Hosted by the National Scout Organization of Thailand, the course highlighted collaboration and the need to adapt Scouting leadership to modern challenges.



WSB APR Staff Workshop Focuses on Data and Sustainability, 2023, Batanes, Philippines

The World Scout Bureau Asia-Pacific Support Centre held its 2023 staff workshop on the theme "Data Analysis and Environmental Sustainability." The two-part program featured data training in Makati with expert Joshua Erdy Tan and sustainability sessions in Basco, Batanes. Participants achieved 94% success in the sustainability training and signed a Commitment to Environmental Sustainability, while also recommending the use of more familiar tools for data analysis.



National Workshop on Scouts for SDGs: Integration to Youth Programme, Sept 2023, TGA Scouts of China

Seventy-one Scout leaders from 13 local councils in Taiwan joined the National Workshop on Scouts for SDGs to enhance the integration of the Better World Framework into the Youth Programme. Over three days, participants explored Scouts4SDGs, Education for Sustainable Development competencies, and the Scouts4SDGs Hub, while sharing best practices to advance local initiatives that support the Sustainable Development Goals.



National Dialogue for Peace Workshop, December 2023, India

From 11–14 December 2023, the Bharat Scouts and Guides hosted the Asia-Pacific Region's National Dialogue for Peace Workshop in Kolkata. Forty-one participants from nine states engaged in sessions on dialogue principles, conflict management, and peacebuilding, with interactive role-plays and games. Facilitated by WOSM-APR leaders and trainers, the workshop prepared Scout leaders to promote dialogue and peace within their communities.



Asia-Pacific AIS Workshop Strengthens Adult Support in Scouting, November 2024, Japan

From 1–4 November 2024, Japan hosted the Asia-Pacific Adults in Scouting (AIS) Workshop, gathering commissioners, volunteers, young adults, and executives from NSOs. Participants explored the World Adults in Scouting Policy, the WOSM Wood Badge Framework, and their links to Youth Programme, Youth Involvement, and Safe from Harm. The event provided a platform to share best practices in volunteer development, digital engagement, and inclusion, reinforcing efforts to strengthen adult management and sustainability in Scouting.



Seminar Exploring the Future of Education in Scouting, November 2024, Nepal



From 14–17 November 2024, Nepal Scouts hosted the Asia-Pacific Seminar on the Future of Education with support from the Region. Scout leaders, commissioners, and education executives discussed applying global frameworks locally, strengthening volunteer management, and designing innovative strategies. Sessions examined SDG 4, insights from the World Scout Education Congress, and the balance of formal and non-formal education.



Asia-Pacific Regional Workshop on Intercultural Dialogue, March 2025, Philippines

The Boy Scouts of the Philippines hosted the Asia-Pacific Regional Workshop on Intercultural Dialogue from 11 to 14 March 2025 in Manila. This workshop focused on promoting Diversity & Inclusion (D&I) by sharing effective practices to support adult volunteers and foster greater empathy across cultural differences within NSOs.

APR Diversity & Inclusion Forum, November 2024, TGA Scouts of China



To support the achievement of Objective No. 3.1 under the Diversity & Inclusion Strategic Priority of the APR Triennial Plan (2022–2025),



the Asia-Pacific Regional Diversity and Inclusion Forum was held from 24 to 27 November 2024, hosted by the General Association of the Scouts of China in Kaohsiung. The forum brought together youth and key Scout leaders from across the Region to exchange best practices, review the APR Diversity and Inclusion Guidelines, and celebrate the cultural diversity within Scouting. Through dynamic workshops and discussions, the event reinforced Scouting's ongoing commitment to inclusivity and its "open for all" ethos.

Social Impact and Advocacy Workshop, June 2025, Malaysia

From 26–29 June 2025, the Asia-Pacific Region held its first Social Impact and Advocacy Workshop in Kuala Lumpur, hosted by Persekutuan Pengakap Malaysia. Bringing together NSO staff and volunteers, the event introduced tools and strategies for measuring and communicating Scouting's impact, while highlighting advocacy, monitoring and evaluation, and Safe from Harm practices. The workshop strengthened cross-NSO collaboration and advanced the Region's capacity to showcase the value of Scouting.



APR Workshop on Health and Well-Being, July 2025, Nepal

Nepal Scouts hosted the Asia-Pacific Regional Workshop on Health and Well-Being from 2–5 July 2025 in Kathmandu. Guided by the Triennial Plan 2022–2025 and Diversity & Inclusion priority, the event introduced the HealthAllies initiative and provided participants with practical tools for self-care, stress management, and peer support. The workshop reaffirmed the Region's commitment to fostering inclusive environments and promoting mental health in Scouting.



Support to Young People

From 2022 to 2024, the APR Scout Foundation consistently supported the participation of young people in key regional events. In 2022, five (5) Regional Youth Representative (RYR) were supported to attend the Regional Scout Committee and Sub-Committee Induction held in May. The following year, in June 2023, three (3) RYRs received support to participate in the Asia-Pacific Youth Mobilization Summit in Malaysia. In October 2024, one (1) RYR was supported to attend the Brand Management Workshop in Bangkok, while an additional two (2) RYR received travel subsidies to take part in other regional events. For 2025, three (3) participants have been approved of travel subsidies.



Grants Approved

Each year, the Asia-Pacific Scout Foundation (APRSF) launches a call for project proposals from NSOs within the Asia-Pacific Scout Region. This initiative aims to support the development and expansion of Scouting across the Region through financial assistance in the form of grants and interest-free loans.

For the year 2024, the Asia-Pacific Scout Foundation approved two projects. The Bhutan Scout Association received a grant of USD \$9,000 to implement the project titled “Implementing Quality Scouting Program for Youth Through Capacity Development” and the Organization of the Scout Movement of Kazakhstan was awarded an interest-free loan of USD \$15,000 for their “Ethno Camp” project. Both projects have been successfully completed, and final reports have been submitted to the Foundation Management Committee (FMC).



Bhutan strengthens Scouting through capacity building of Unit Leaders

The Bhutan Scouts Association (BSA), with support from the Asia-Pacific Regional Scout Foundation (APRSF) and the Royal Government of Bhutan, has successfully implemented the project “Implementing Quality Scouting Program for Young People through Capacity Development of Scout Unit Leaders.”

The initiative has trained more than 806 adult Scout leaders across six districts through the Basic Unit Leaders Training (BULT) Course, marking the

largest training effort in BSA’s history.

Over 800 teachers took part in the five-day residential course, significantly enhancing their professional capacity and motivation as volunteers. The training not only improved technical competencies but also strengthened the spirit of service, ensuring a more dynamic and effective Scouting program in schools.

The project has also introduced a “whole-school approach scouting pro-

gram,” now adopted in all participating districts. This has increased the visibility of Scouting in communities, empowered young people to take on leadership roles, and strengthened the link between schools and communities.

Recognizing the success, the Ministry of Education and Skills Development has formally acknowledged Scouting as an alternative pathway to education, validating its role in the holistic development of Bhutanese youth.

This milestone has further encouraged schools nationwide to embrace the model.

“This is our greatest achievement in the history of Bhutan Scouts Association—training a large number of adult leaders with minimal resources,” Tashi Namgyal, Bhutan Scouts Chief Commissioner shared, expressing deep gratitude to APRSF, district administrations, and the Ministry for their continued support.



Ethno Camp Boosts Scouting in Kazakhstan

The Organization of the Scout Movement of Kazakhstan, with support from the APR Scout Foundation, successfully implemented the Ethno Camp project, making a strong impact on youth and communities.

More than 350 children aged 11–15 took part in cultural and educational programs that combined traditional

crafts, games, and survival skills such as fire building, first aid, and orientation. The camp not only enhanced confidence and adaptability but also nurtured leadership, communication, and teamwork through group challenges and peer-led activities.

Families noticed positive changes at home, as young people shared their

new skills with their siblings and friends. With this, more and more parents expressed interest in wanting their children join Scouting.

The project improved Scouting's public image, attracting new adult volunteers and sparking membership interest among families. It also provided the Scout Organization

with a venue for future activities and fostered stronger partnerships with schools, cultural institutions, and local authorities.

By motivating young people to stay active and contribute to their communities, Ethno Camp has become a valuable platform for the long-term growth of Scouting in Kazakhstan.

Fundraising Activities & Initiatives

Asia-Pacific Regional Scout Foundation strengthens regional support through successful fundraising dinners

From 2022 to 2025, the Asia-Pacific Regional Scout Foundation (APRSF) successfully organized four fundraising dinners across the region, generously hosted by the Scout Association of Hong Kong, the National Scout Organization of Thai-

land, the General Association of the Scouts of China, and the Scout Association of Japan.

Each dinner highlighted the recognition of the new and upgraded members enjoying the the unique culture and traditions of the host country through auctions of significant items, raffles, and cultural performances. In Hong Kong (February 2023), the dinner raised around US\$30,000 with strong backing from regional leaders. Thailand (April 2024) followed, generating around US\$15,000. Taipei (October 2024) gathered over 130 supporters and raised more than US\$23,000. Finally, in Fukuoka (May 2025), Japan's event raised over US\$11,000.

Together, these memorable evenings highlighted the spirit of unity and service that defines Scouting in the Asia-Pacific Region.


